## Newsletter from SJLT, March 2020

Dear readers of Scandinavian Journal for Leadership & Theology

It is a great pleasure to announce that eight new articles have now been published in the 2019 edition of SJLT. Heinke Röbken and Marcel Schütz from the University of Oldenburg, Germany, write about visitation projects as a decision program in the Protestant church. Patrik Hagman and Eetu Kejonen from the Åbo Akademi University in Finland, write about how young priests in Finland and Sweden understand gender, church, and leadership. Tormod Kleiven from VID Specialized University, Norway, writes about how legitimate and legitimised power is exercised in collegial and church committee meetings in a church context.

A group of researchers at Norwegian School of Leadership and Theology in Oslo, consisting of Karl Inge Tangen, Truls Åkerlund, Jan Inge Jenssen, John Daniel L. Andersen and Åse-Miriam Smitsrød, have authored articles with very relevant themes from the context in which they write – but with relevance for many churches. The themes of these articles are: a Pentecostal perspective on female leadership in the church, servant leadership and power, Pentecostal eschatology and social engagement – and finally an article on how strategic leadership can be applied to the development of the local church. Lars Råmunddal and Reidar Salvesen from Ansgar University College, Kristiansand, have written an article that raises the question of whether we need a theology for change in churches.

Thanks to all of you dedicated writers for your contributions to the 2019 issue of SJLT.

I can also inform you good readers that SJLT's website (<a href="https://sjlt-journal.com/">https://sjlt-journal.com/</a>) has now been updated. Hopefully the website will be easier to use as well as looking better. We would like feedback from our readers about the functionality of the website. Some good news where the development of SJLT is concerned is that in March/April 2020 the first book will be published containing articles previously published in SJLT.
